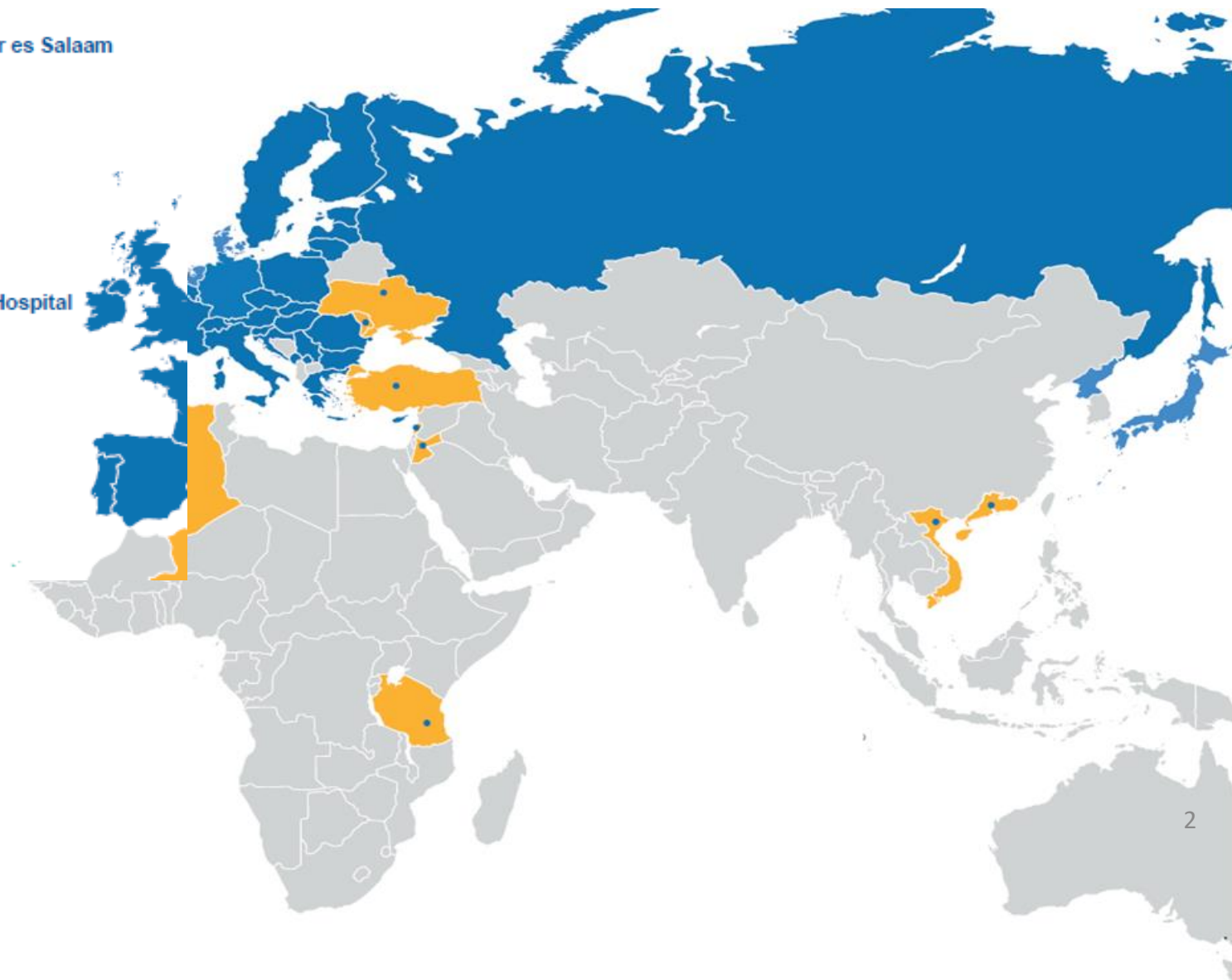

OECD World activities 2024 and ongoing program for 2025

The first OECD World meeting was held in September 10-12, 2024 in Milano.
All the centers were there except Vietnam and Colombia.
All participants signed a memorandum of understanding (MOU) ,
Vietnam signed in October and Colombia in November.

A TOTAL OF 12 MEMBERS AT THE END OF 2024 ARE PART OF OECD World.

The following objectives were set
for OECl World :

Objective 1: Quality and accreditation i.e., establishing standards for cancer care and accreditation among members.

- FALP Chile : already accredited as a Cancer Centre
- A preliminary diagnosis was performed for China, Tanzania, Vietnam, Algeria and Moldova.
- OECD World will help to prepare these Centres on the way to Quality

Objective 2: is to help and support a South American project to set up a sister organisation to OEI.

A meeting was held November 6th in Santiago :

FALP, Camargo, National Institute of Bogota, Auna in Lima Peru, Solca in Ecuador and Goias from Brazil are funding members of OLACI.

Institute Alexander Fleming from Argentina will join to reach the funding members (7).

Objective 3: is to help inter Member's relationships within OECD World between our associates' members Type B and European OECD members.

Objective 4: is to collaborate with the IARC and WHO programs in the 12 countries members of OECD World

- Dr. BASO from IARC and Andre IBAWI from WHO were present in the Milano meeting.
- More structuration of this objective has to be done in 2025.

Objective 5: is to understand better the need of our associate members type B.

T Philip has already been in China, Jordan, Lebanon, Chile, Moldova, Algeria, Tanzania and Vietnam

It is scheduled to go to Turkey, Colombia and maybe Brazil in 2025.

Objective 6 : is to support National Cancer plan.

- Such was the case in 2023/2024 for the Lebanon Cancer plan where OECD is officially the International Sponsor.
- Support also candidacy to Europe (Moldova), Chapter 28 (presentation of Cancer in Moldova)

OECD World ongoing program in 2025

- Accreditation and Designation is the priority #1

4 centres are very close to apply and now officially candidate :

- King Hussein Cancer Centre (KHCC) , Amman , Jordan
- A.C. Camargo Cancer Centre , Sao Paulo, Brazil
- National Institute Chisinau, Moldavia
- Blida Cancer Centre, Algeria.

- Accreditation and Designation

Vietnam, China and Tanzania are working hard :

- In connection with Simon OBERST, we will help them to improve on their way to quality. None of these Centres are ready in 2025, for scheduling even a date for a candidacy.
- For others, we would perform a diagnosis of their quality system using the model already used for several centres.

OLACI (Latin America) is the priority #2

This network is created with 7 funding Members. Obviously, this number will increase in 2025.

- OECD world will follow the development of the networks and help when required.

General Objective: To promote the exchange of institutional best practices and explore opportunities for the development of collaborative international research.

Recent Progress:

The group has held several meetings where summaries of each institution's main research lines were presented. This exchange allowed for the identification of common areas of interest.

Some of the topics that have been discussed as shared priorities include:

- Health Technology Assessment (HTA) models for high-cost treatments.
- The development and management of oncology biobanks

OLACI Working Group:

W.G. Benchmark:

Participating Institutions: AC Camargo (Brazil), FALP (Chile)

General Objective: To foster collaborative learning through the sharing of a set of indicators, with the aim of building a system in which every institution grows and contributes to the overall improvement of oncology care in Latin America.

Recent Progress:

The group has held a series of meetings aimed at defining a shared set of indicators, with a primary focus on outcome measures:

GENERAL INDICATORS such as survival rates, waiting times, in-hospital mortality rate, and NPS.

ESPECIFIC INDICATOR: Two indicator for key areas : Surgery, Medical Oncology, Hemato-oncology, Radiotherapy, Clinical Trials.

Example: SURGERY: 30 days mortality & 90 days readmission rate.

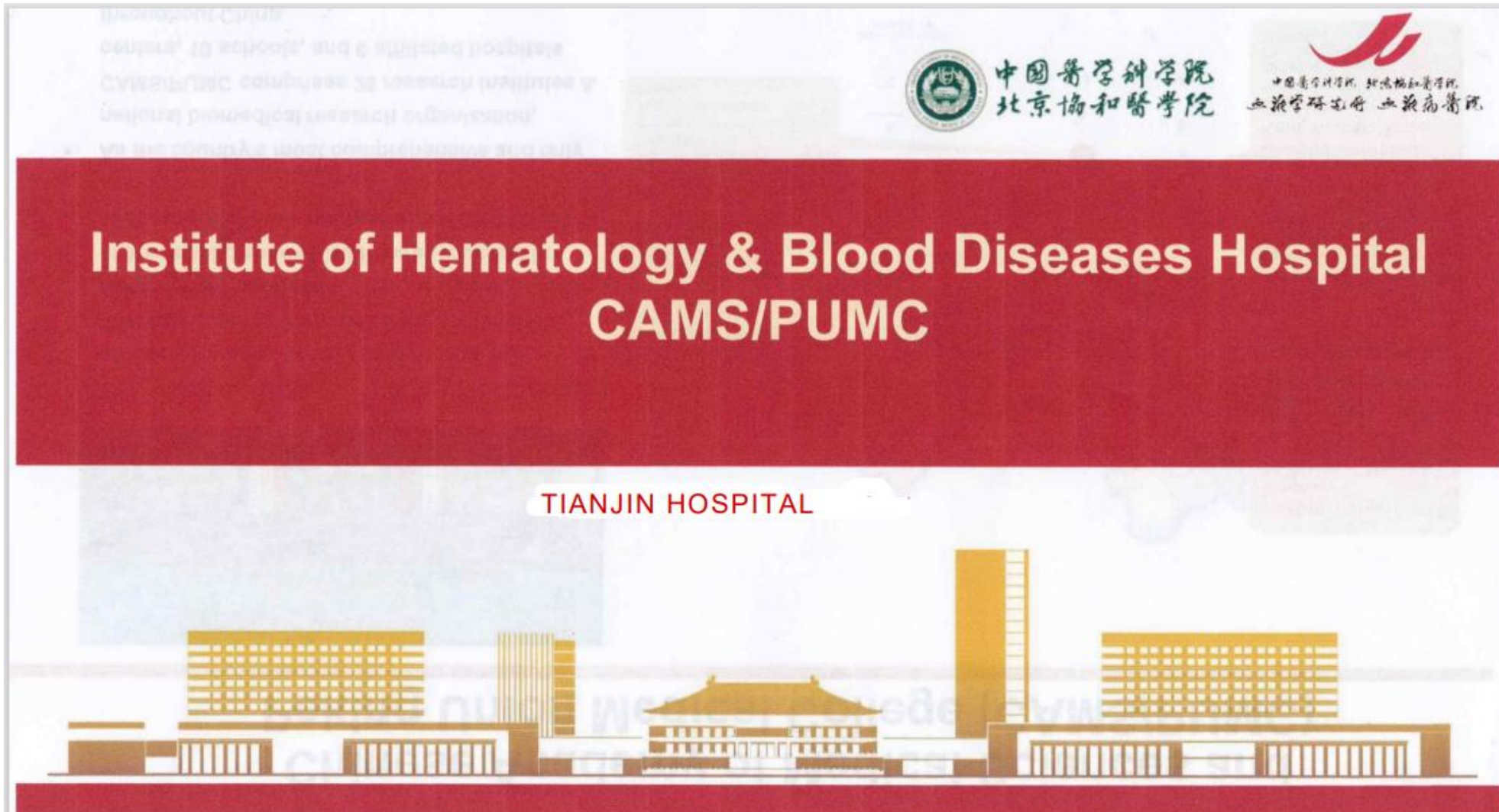
