BACKGROUND - EUROPE'S BEATING CANCER PLAN

- The Cancer Plan addresses cancer in an integrated, health-in-all-policies and multi-stakeholder approach
- Four pillars: (1) prevention; (2) early detection; (3) diagnosis and treatment; and (4) quality of life of cancer patients and survivors
- Cross-cutting themes: research and innovation, digital and personalised medicine, reducing inequalities, paediatric cancer
- 10 flagship initiatives and 32 actions at every key stage of the disease
- 4 billion EUR budget

- Lesson learnt from Covid-19 impact on cancer patients and care
- The Cancer Plan works in tandem with the Horizon Europe Mission on Cancer
- Governance of the cancer plan
- Regular exchanges with the other EU institutions
- Implementation Roadmap with milestones and timeline

- ✓ Launched June 2021
- 2. European Cancer Imaging Initiative
- ✓ Launched in December 2022



SAVING LIVES THROUGH SUSTAINABLE CANCER PREVENTION

- 3. Eliminate cancers caused by Human papillomavirus
- ✓ Joint Action on HPV vaccination launched November 2022 (JA PERCH)
- ✓ 2 Action Grants launched: Protect-Europe (January 2023), ReThinkHPVaccination (February 2023)





IMPROVING EARLY DETECTION OF CANCER

- 4. EU Cancer Screening Scheme
- ✓ Council Recommendation on Cancer Screening adopted in December 2022
- ✓ 3 Cancer Screening Projects launched in March April 2023:
 - ✓ Praise-U (prostate cancer)
 - ✓ Solace (lung cancer)
 - √ Togas (gastric cancer)



Updated EU Cancer Screening Council Recommentations

Extending access to targeted cancer screening for breast, colorectal and cervical cancers along with <u>a step-by-step approach</u> to introducing prostate, lung and gastric cancer testing.




BREAST CANCER suggesting a lower age limit of 45 and a higher age limit of 74 (standard 50 – 69), plus MRI scans when medically appropriate



HPV testing for women aged 30 to 65, every 5 years or more, to detect CERVICAL CANCER, taking account of HPV vaccination status



Triage testing for COLORECTAL CANCER in people aged 50 – 74 through faecal immunochemical testing (FIT) to determine follow-up via endoscopy/colonoscopy



LUNG CANCER testing for individuals at high risk (i.e. smokers), incl. prevention approaches



Prostate specific antigen testing for PROSTATE CANCER in men, plus MRI scans for follow-up



In places with high GASTRIC CANCER incidence and death rates, screening for Helicobacter pylori and surveillance of precancerous stomach lesions

- ✓ Joint Action launched November 2022 (JA CraNE)
- ✓ Joint Action on Networks of Expertise started October 2022 (JA JANE)
- 6. Cancer Diagnostic and Treatment for All
- ✓ Personalised Cancer Medicine for all EU citizens (PCM4EU project) started January 2023
- ✓ Building the EU Cancer and Public Health Genomics platform CAN.HEAL started in November 2022
- ✓ Improving diagnostics and survival for all children with Acute Myeloid Leukaemia (CHIP-AML22 project) started November 2022
