Dear OECI Members,

Dear Colleagues and Friends,

With this edition of the Oncology Days, OECI's longest presidency comes to an end. The past five years have led us towards a better understanding of the path OECI must follow to strengthen its position and serve cancer community and patients. It has been a long and arduous journey, with obstacles to overcome along the way and doubts to dispel, and many have been the fervid debates around OECI's goals and strategies.

Undoubtedly, the Accreditation and Designation Programme has helped us keep the compass straight towards our goals. It is thanks to the Programme that we attracted a large number of members who believe in our mission: promoting the highest quality, equitable patient care, and honing the pipeline research-assistance within our certified centres.

In the meantime, our horizon has cleared and we are seeing now that no other organisation could better interpret the meaning of the main European initiatives – namely, the Cancer Mission and Europe's Beating Cancer Plan. As our potential is steadily unfolding, we have participated in several European initiatives aiming to drive research into the future, and organise national health and research systems to better fit the European framework.

Pioneers in cancer research and treatment, it is our duty to pave the way towards ground breaking solutions. In the coming years, we will be turning our eye toward younger generations – the future we all bear responsibility for. OECI sets out to develop young talent by organising a series of training courses on designing and managing EC applications and projects, with the aim of developing a new class of experts needed by the global oncology community to tackle future challenges and reduce the burden of cancer.

The path that led us to OECI45 is also the result of the contribution of the Working Groups and our members' active involvement in our agenda, paired with an inspired and effective management.

The past years have also brought to light a growing body of evidence on the benefits of shared decision making with our patients. We have learnt that it is essential for health care professionals to move away from 'top-down' approach and connect with patients on decisions about their care. This is an important step forward, and the reason why we formalised our link with the European Cancer Patients Coalition (ECPC).

As the collaboration with ECPC seeks to produce change of mindset in terms of how cancer is perceived by European society, we hope to develop a European model for survivorship care plan based on the close collaboration of Cancer centres/networks and patient organisations.

It is imperative that we actively engage and listen to our patients, and we are set to continue developing our "Collaborations for Good Practices with Patients" WG, as we aim to significantly expand its activities and transform it into an OECI core programme.

The COVID-19 pandemic hit us for two years. Nevertheless, it did not stop our activities, which quickly turned into remote events, proving that with new technologies we can do more and sometimes better. We optimised times and reduced high organisational costs, whilst also facilitating frequent exchange of ideas and opinions.

Even so, the 15<sup>th</sup> edition of the Oncology Days - whose first edition was organised in Genoa in 2008 - is an important moment in the OECI community. They allows us to maintain and

reinforce those human relationships that are the basis of social life in sincere friendship. With 130 centres/institutes in our membership, each one of us can easily connect to a colleague and a friend throughout the entire Union and beyond its borders.

We especially extend our thanks to all the members that have supported the organisation of the Oncology Days over the past years, showing us what their territories had best to offer, and allowing us to learn more about a wealth of traditions and cultures.

Looking at the past year, Ukraine's invasion, with its disastrous economic and social consequences, provoked a fracture with our Russian colleagues. We sincerely hope we will be able to re-establish a dialogue with them soon, as we are aware of the important role they have played since the establishment of OECI, an organisation created to heal and unite.

During this edition of the Oncology Days, we will actively collaborate with our Ukrainian colleagues to define a European intervention plan. The latter will aim at reorganising the Ukrainian health system, rebuilding infrastructures damaged by the conflict and promoting participation in research activities. Likewise, upon resolution of the conflict, OECI will be proud to strongly support our Russian Members, which we not hold responsible for the drama the two countries are experiencing.

We hope the EU and Member States authorities will understand the effort that OECI is preparing to undertake, and help us in this path by participating in a common initiative that will be useful for the entire healthcare system.

Finally, a special mention goes to Professor Claude Lagarde, who hosted the OECI General Assembly in 1983 in Bordeaux, and Professor Thomas Tursz, who organised the event in Paris in 2003. They were two well-respected scientists and friends we will forever cherish and honour.

To conclude, we are immensely grateful to Institut Curie for kindly offering to host this edition of the OECI Oncology Days. We hope you enjoy the OECI Oncology Days 2023 in Paris - an event dedicated to celebrating the 120<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of first Nobel Prize award to Marie Skłodowska-Curie.

The Paris Oncology Days meeting is dedicated to the anniversary of the 1<sup>st</sup> Nobel Prize of Maria Sklodowska Curie.



The Nobel Prize in Physics was awarded 120 years ago in 1903 to Marie and Pierre Curie, as well as Henri Becquerel, for their joint discovery of radioactivity. Two years earlier, the German physicist, Wilhelm Conrad Röntgen, had received the same prize for the discovery of X-rays.

In 1911, Maria Sklodowska Curie was awarded a second Nobel Prize, this time in chemistry. She is the only woman to have received two Nobel Prizes in two different disciplines.

One hundred years later, the Fondation Curie remains a model for treating patients with cancer, and for interdisciplinary and multidisciplinary fundamental research. This adventure has involved several stages, with the Institut du Radium – an institution of science – as its starting point. The Fondation Curie was a pioneer in the research-care continuum, a pioneer of the Curie-Regaud model. These are its roots. Then came the dispensary, with applications administered to patients. Medical treatment is the second part of the history of Institut Curie, and is based on innovation and the link of research. From the very outset, the board of education for the Ile de France (Paris) region has been a founding member. Research cannot be considered without universities and without students.

This Research – knowledge transmission – Care connection is at the heart of the Curie-Regaud model.

Today the Hospital Group is similar to a Cancer Center, without technically being one. In a traditional Cancer Center, the Chief Executive – a physician – appoints a Research Director and an Administrative Director. At Institut Curie, three directors of equal standing work together. First of all, the Research Center director. This research is first of all fundamental-free in its choices, its models and its subjects – then translational, moving on to clinical application. Next comes the director of the Hospital Group, responsible for patient care and clinical research. Lastly, the director of the Head Office, responsible for all elements common to the entities, and as such involved in the actions of the governing bodies.

Today, the Supervisory Board has the powers of a Board of Directors, and appoints the Executive Board. The Executive Board is like an orchestra conductor, responsible in particular for the cooperation of the three entity directors. It is not a substitute for the entity directors, but it is responsible – alongside the Supervisory Board – for coordination and the link between research, care, universities and teaching, which characterize the Curie model.

What we also learn from the history of Institut Curie, is that this model is also characterized by its ability to adapt in an environment in constant flux. In this changing environment, Institut Curie remains a touchstone in the fight against cancer, which starts with the understanding of the complexity of Science, in order to move towards clinical applications, and which also passes beyond our walls into society as a whole. Interdisciplinarity, multidisciplinary, team spirit and collaboration, generosity and commitment... these are some key notions that drive us in this struggle for the greater good.

Maria Sklodowska Curie have also established a Marie Curie Centre -The Maria Sklodowska-Curie National Research Institute of Oncology- in her hometown in Warsaw.

The two Marie Curie centres are now very strongly linked in both joint work and the presence of Prof. Iwona Lugowska on the OECI Board makes this strong link between France and Poland visible at the European level, which corresponds to the European convictions of Maria Sklodowska Curie.

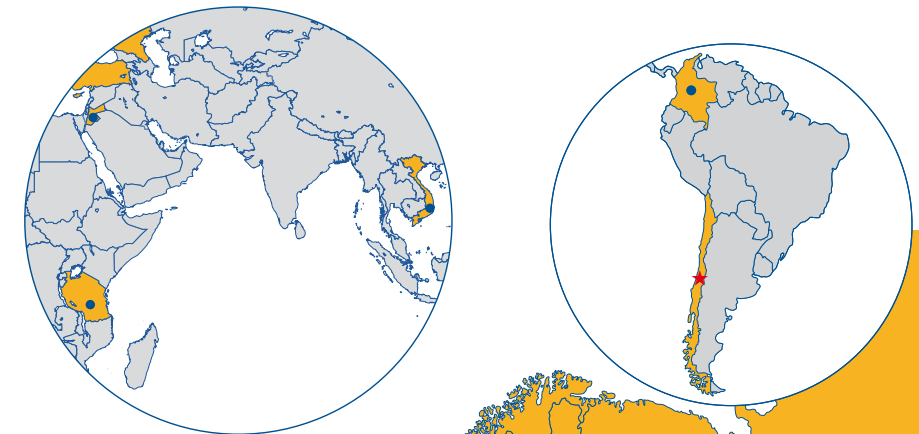

## History of Paris

The history of Paris is linked to the conjunction of several geographical and political factors. It was Clovis who decided, in the 6<sup>th</sup> century, to install the fixed organs of the kingdom's political power in the small city of the Parisii. This position as capital was confirmed by the Capetians, after a two-century interlude during the Carolingian period.

Paris' position at the crossroads of land and river trade routes in the heart of a rich agricultural region made it one of the leading cities in France during the 10<sup>th</sup> century, with royal palaces, rich abbeys and a cathedral; during the 12<sup>th</sup> century, Paris became one of the leading centres in Europe for education and the art.

Whether it was the Fronde, the French Revolution or May 1968, Paris has always been at the heart of events that have marked French history.

The « Bibliothèque historique de la ville de Paris » allows the public to immerse themselves in the historical memory of Paris and the Île-de-France region, from a wide variety of perspectives.
