to <u>improve quality</u> and <u>decrease inequalities</u> in cancer care in Europe, in order to:


Decrease mortality, improve survival and ameliorate QoL

- a wider participation of all Member States and Affiliated Countries
- → a direct involvement of all the relevant stake-holders in the co-design and project implementation, including citizens and patients
 - → aligment and coordination at national and European level



Cancer Mission



13 Recommendations for bold actions

- 1 Launch UNCAN.eu a European Initiative to Understand Cancer
- 2 Develop an EU-wide research programme to identify (poly-) genic risk scores
- 3 Support the development and implementation of effective cancer prevention strategies and policies within Member States and the EU
- 4 Optimise existing screening programmes and develop novel approaches for screening and early detection
- 5 Advance and implement personalised medicine approaches for all cancer patients in Europe
- 6 Develop an EU-wide research programme on early diagnostic and minimally invasive treatment technologies
- Develop an EU-wide research programme and policy support to improve the quality of life of cancer patients and survivors, family members and carers, and all persons with an increased risk of cancer
- 8 Create a European Cancer Patient Digital Centre where cancer patients and survivors can deposit and share their data for personalised care
- 9 Achieve Cancer Health Equity in the EU across the continuum of the disease
- 10 Set up a network of Comprehensive Cancer Infrastructures within and across all EU Member States to increase quality of research and care
- 11 Childhood cancers and cancers in adolescents and young adults: cure more and cure better
- 12 Accelerate innovation and implementation of new technologies and create Oncology-focused Living Labs to conquer cancer
- 13 Transform cancer culture, communication and capacity building



Cancer Mission Calls

	2021	2022	2023

Budget	128.65	126	110.68

CM calls Participation

- 140 received proposals in the nine 2021 and 2022 calls
 - 32 accepted
- 107 received in the four 2023 calls
 - Under evaluation
- Large variability in participation
 - From 1 to 50 (mean 13, top 50)
- Large variability in success rate and coordination

- An new* instrument to assess the (HR)-QoL of cancer patients and survivors in order to monitor the effect/impact of EU funded projects
- Available in all the EU languages

^{*} All the available tools were developed in the late 90's and were designed to be used prevalently in research

Definition of QoL

The Quality of American Life: Perceptions, Evaluations and Satisfactions Angus Campbell, Philip E. Converse and Willard L. Rodgers New York: Russell Sage Foundation, 1976, pp. xi, 583

What is the quality of life? For the authors it is the individual's perceived level of satisfaction with life in general, which is related to level of satisfaction in various life domains, such as work, family, residential environment, and so on.

HR-QoL

A restricted and operative definition of those components of QoL that are related to Health and thus are correlated with Health Care interventions....




